CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

New retail study for Leamington. WDC have recently decided to commission a new study of the retail requirements for Leamington with particular regard to the rise of internet shopping and implications for the proposed Chandos Street car park retail development.

This society welcomes the new study, and has been arguing for one for some time. The last study, by consultants DTZ, was published in 2004 when the retail scene was very different from that today.

Programme. We need to ensure that our Programme reflects what members want so we are canvassing your views – more on this below.

Licensing. Andrew Cave, a member of this society and Chairman of CLARA, recently attended a high level meeting in the Prime Minister's Delivery Unit on tackling alcohol fuelled rowdiness in town centres.

Andrew also explains below how much Gordon Goddard-Pickett is doing for both us and the people of Leamington in monitoring town centre licensing applications.

Open spaces. New proposals (in the form of a SPD or Supplementary Planning Document) by WDC on Open Spaces seek to protect our open areas including sports grounds like tennis clubs and cricket grounds. The aims are good; the question is whether they will be tight enough to prevent developers and owners building on our remaining open spaces to the loss of the wider community.

Loss of members. In the last few months a number of prominent members who have played major roles in the society over the years have died – Jack Watkins, David Hayes and his wife Daphne, Nicki Hall and Beryl Mullin.

AGM May. The formal notice of our AGM is included with this Newsletter. This year the formal business will be followed by an informal wine and cheese party.

EVENTS TO JULY 2009

Basil Spence and Coventry Cathedral, Dr Louise Campbell

Tuesday, 10 February, 7.30, Pump Room Annexe

Coventry Cathedral, designed and rebuilt 1951-1962, is one of the most important and controversial works of post-war British architecture. The designer, Basil Spence, had to reconcile the ideas of the Provost and Chapter, Coventry City Council and the array of outstanding modern artists (Epstein, Sutherland, Piper ...) whom he commissioned, while respecting the ruins of the old Cathedral.

Louise Campbell, a Reader in the History of Art at Warwick University, spent four years leading a research project on the life and work of Basil Spence.

Regency Leamington: Preserve or Conserve? Dr Tony Forward

Thursday 12 March 7.45, Oddfellows Hall

How significant is the legacy left to Leamington Spa by the architects who worked here in the 18th and 19th centuries? What makes the town special? What are the threats to it in the 21st century? How can we best safeguard it?

Dr Forward will discuss the importance of planned development during building boom of early 19th century and point out the contrasts between natural and man-made structures, solids and voids, enclosure and openness. How were the streets, squares, crescents, facades etc composed? What of the future? How might Leamington look ten or twenty years hence?

Mr Booth, Senior Archivist of Warwick Record Office, will give an illustrated lecture on the archives for which the Leamington Society and its members gave £4,000 last year. He will discuss both the documents in the collection and the wealth of information about the Willes family and its local estates over the last 800 years, with particular emphasis on their part in the development of Leamington Spa.

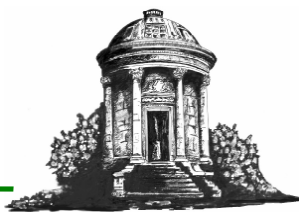
